Dear Mr. Lorch,

- 1) This letter, whose composition rests upon both Richard and myself, is intended to introduce to you our exchange of letters so far, and give you a mild preview of the linguistic format, or phases of composition which might follow.
- 2) We will probably be re-writing these letters in terms of the exacting content of our presentation; we have yet, however, to raise any particular questions or establish the ground of our possible responses- what is scientific or practical in our exchange so far might be re-written for presentation, and the epistemological question of why and what we may write about what we do have yet to receive some clarification. We will probably let the epistemological questions develop in the architectures and styles of composition, for the begin with we write letters.
- 3) We are writing letters. We are forwarding you copies of these you may find interesting. We could rewrite what we have already written. Maybe we are being minimalistic, ecological, or lazy. We can send you what we already have written, a bunch of stuff, just like we promised, for only the cost of an introduction. We could rewrite these letters for the purposes of presentation. But, presentation of what? My brother and I, we are writing letters, maybe he will have a better explanation.
- 4) So we are sending you the backlog of our correspondence on the general topic we mentioned to you, and will be next up to this point regarding the distributional architecture we have agreed upon.
- 5) Our phases of composition ~~and simple~~ will probably be as follows:
 - a) unbound discussion and simple exchange of letters. (we will take advantage of our proximity and time spaces of the holiday hopefully)
 - b) tabled discussion
discussion from specific linguistic reference such as discussion from Hannah Arendt's political philosophy, from Hegelian psychology etc., etc.,...

Possible rule: that whoever introduces such a discussion should provide copies of the discussion 'table' i.e. buy three copies at least of Hannah's book, or of others books or xerox copies etc.
